Whole School Curriculum Focuses:

Religious Education:

Value Focus: This term we focus on the Fruit of the Holy Spirit - Faithfulness - Whakapono. We will focus on ways to show we are faithful, how to keep our promises to others and to God, and on showing we are proud to be Catholic

Term 1 Religious Education Curriculum Focus: Strands: Prayer and Jesus

Te Reo Māori:

In Term 1 the whole school is focusing on mihimihi and pepeha. The aim is that students will be able to say a simple pepeha in an age appropriate situation. Junior classes will begin with introducing themselves and naming their school, with more detail added in as students grow in age and confidence. Many of our senior students will be able to confidently say their pepeha in public speaking situations such as leading assemblies.

Health and Wellbeing - Growth Mindset and the Learning Pit:

It is important that children know how their brains learn, and that learning isn't always easy! Across the school this term we will be teaching children about the concepts of Growth vs Fixed Mindset, and "The Learning Pit" so that they come to understand the importance of taking risks, persevering, making mistakes and working hard for successful outcomes.

Technology and Arts at Fairfield Intermediate

Every Friday, Year 7&8 students have lessons at Fairfield Intermediate in their specialised facilities. The first block of lessons commence in Week 3, Friday February 19th. Over the course of the four terms, students will rotate through the 5 different classes.

The 5 classes for 2021 will be:

Science **DVC (Design and visual communication - art and tech drawing)**
Hauora **Workshop** **Art**

Logistics for Techni at Fairfield Intermediate:

We walk to and from Fairfield Intermediate on Fridays, so students need to be prepared. This includes wearing a school sunhat during Summer and bringing a raincoat and/or umbrella if it looks like it may rain.

During Terms One and Four, children need to bring sneakers to wear for health and safety when working in the tech rooms. Please wear school sandals to school then change into your sneakers. Once we return to school, children will change back into their sandals so they are in correct school uniform.

The timetabling of Techni lessons for 2021 is different to what it was last year:

In Week A, lessons begin at 9:10am until 10:40am. In Week B, lessons start at 11:05am -12:35pm, with a break for Lunch, and then recommence at 12:55pm -2:20pm. Children will be back at St Joseph's for 2:45pm pick up.

If your child is late or has an appointment during Techni time, they will need to be taken to or collected from Fairfield Intermediate – please communicate with class teachers prior to this happening if this is the case.

Year 7&8 Immunisations - Information Session

Monday 15th February (Week 3)

The Public Health Nurse will be speaking to students about immunisations which are available for Year 7&8. Parents are also welcome to attend the session if they wish, but do not have to, as students will bring home information and consent forms for:

- Year 8's – HPV (Human Papillomavirus)
- Year 7's – Boostrix immunisation for diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus.

BYOD (Bring Your Own Device)

If your child has a laptop or ipad which can be used for their learning, **we encourage you to take up our BYOD option.** We have secure storage for devices at school. A copy of our BYOD agreement has been sent home and children are learning about safe practices in class as part of our Cybersafety unit of study. Please sign and return this to class teachers if your child can bring their own device.

Mobile Phones:

At St Joseph's Fairfield, cellphones are not permitted at school unless parents have written a letter to the Principal outlining its purpose. If this is agreed, the cellphone will be powered off and left in the Principal's office until the end of the day when it will be handed back as the child leaves the school grounds.

Home Learning in Year 7&8

Our homework routines will begin properly in Week 4. Whilst we value home learning, we are also aware that some children have many commitments outside of school hours, so we always keep homework requirements reasonable.

If your child says "I don't have any homework this week"....that is not true! Weekly homework for all students will be:

- Maths Buddy – questions that can be completed online over the course of the week (approx 20-30 minutes).
- Daily reading for at least 20 minutes each evening. This doesn't have to be students reading on their own - reading to and with your child is still important, even at Year 7&8. Read newspapers, articles online, books, comics....anything! Read and talk about it together!

In addition to these weekly tasks, students may be asked to complete class work or have projects to complete at different times of the year. Check their homework books for information on when a task might be due.

Our Year 7&8 students are great role models. They wear their uniform proudly and it is fantastic to see everyone looking so smart at the start of the year. Please remember:

Welcome to the Junior School Year 0-3 for Term One 2021.

We hope that you and your children have had a wonderful break and enjoyed the summer sun, and are ready to start a new school year. We trust that everyone is settling into their new classes. No doubt this beautiful weather will continue over the next few weeks, so make sure your children come to school with their hat and a large bottle of water each day, thank goodness we all have air conditioning!

- ❖ A reminder that all children are required to wear a hat at break times. The school policy is; **no hat, no play outside the shaded areas**
- ❖ Also be on the lookout for those little creatures (head lice). They particularly enjoy the warmer weather so please check your child's hair regularly and treat when necessary. Junior children are particularly prone to head-lice as they have close contact with each other. It is helpful to inform your class teacher if you discover your child has head lice.

During the next few weeks homework will begin to come home. This generally takes the form of a reader and spelling type activities. Please ensure that all homework material sent home is returned to school every day. We have a **Junior School Home Learning Guide Book**, which most will have received as your child entered school, please refer to this for guidance in regards to home activities. Please see your class teacher if you do not have one of these.

In the Junior School, literacy and numeracy are our core focuses.

- In written language we encourage children to become independent writers from the beginning. The children are asked to attempt to write their own stories, regardless of their letter or word knowledge. All approximations are accepted and correct letters and words are modelled by the teacher. If your child wants to write at home, first encourage them to write independently.
- Most nights (starting next week) your child will bring home a reading or alphabet book for you to share together. Listen to your child read. If they are at the beginning stages of reading, help them to point to the words. Encourage your child to gain sense from the story. Resist jumping in and correcting errors but ask questions like; "Did that sound right?" "What does that word start with, can you make some of the sounds for that word?" Our aim is to create in children a love of books and to lead them towards being independent readers. To do this, we teach them strategies to cope with an unknown word. You can help by setting aside a regular time each night to read to your child. The bedtime story is the most valuable way to ensure a healthy attitude towards reading. Please refer to the Junior School Home Learning Guide.
- Mathematical concepts are found in everyday life. It is important that your child understands that mathematics is all around them, it is not just something that you do at school. Encourage them to read numbers. Say the number that comes before and after. Play board and card games as a family. Get your child to help read recipes. Take everyday situations and use them in a simple number story. Check the Maths ladder page in the home learning guide for strategies to support learning in the class.

Children progress with their learning at different rates. It is important to remember not to compare your child with another.

We have started a unit based around understanding what learning is and building relationships as a learning community. Later in the term we will begin a Health Topic; Firewise. Our local fire services will be assisting us with this and your child may have some tasks for you to complete as a family.
